## Bikers red ride raises £4,000

**PROJECTS that aid veterans received £4,000 from the Ring of Red M60 (Manchester) Remembrance ride.**

On Remembrance Sunday 2024, thousands of bikers and supporters lined up at Birch Services wearing red and then, in convoy, they left to complete a circuit of the M60 motorway that loops around Manchester.

For the second year, Veterans In Communities was selected by the event organisers to benefit from money raised through donations on the day and the sale of merchandise.

The Haslingden Centre was opened up on a Sunday to welcome the team from the Ring of Red including organisers Jeanette Netty Kiely and Mandi Latham-Holmes and riders from Throttle Twisters MCC who rode over from Oldham.

VIC Chief Executive Amanda Walton said: "We

have not decided how the funds will be used, but they will all go for the benefit of our veteran members to help subsidise trips and other activities.

"It is important to me, that donations kindly given to VIC are not spent on core costs of running the business and that our members benefit from the generosity of others."

In May, VIC has been invited to the Throttle Twisters for their annual camp at Alderley Edge.

VIC Operations Manager Bob Elliott said: "It was a great opportunity to bring together the Throttle Twisters Motor Cycle Club and the Ring of Red, as both support VIC and we also had members of VIC bringing their own bikes along.

"We would like to say thank you to Ring of Red for supporting us again this year and some of their members will also be on the camp in May.

"We were able to show



both groups around the VIC Centre and they also learnt a lot more about what goes on there and met some of our members."

Amanda added: "We are so grateful for the continued support from Ring of Red

and to everyone who donated on the day; it makes such a difference to the support we can provide."

VIC has again been selected as the charity for November's Ring of Red.

# VE80 celebrations

**THERE are lots of events being held to celebrate the 80th anniversary of VE Day.**

VIC is organising two celebrations, one in Haslingden and a second in Clitheroe.

On **Thursday May 8**, exactly 80 years since Victory in Europe was declared, VIC is organising a breakfast and meet up for veterans from all over Rossendale at Haslingden Community Link from **9.30am to 11.30am**.

The breakfast costs just £2 per person and has been subsidised by a grant from Lancashire County Council.

In the afternoon, the VIC Centre in Bury Road will be

open to all and a special VE themed quiz will be held.

Also on **May 8**, veteran Bob Brindley will be lighting a candle at Rakefoot Methodist Church, Crawshawbooth.

While VIC Ribble Valley will be holding its usual meet up at Trinity Methodist Church, Wesleyan Row, Clitheroe, on **Tuesday May 6** and all activities will have a VE-Day celebration theme.

Project Worker Ray Sharkey said: "At 10am we are all getting suited and booted as a mark of respect to all who fell during the Second World War.

"Quizmaster Ron Flowers will deliver a VE day quiz to the Trinity community people at the

'Warm Hub' after our own Coffee Morning and Quiz.

"We will also be visited by Steven Walmsley from Healthwatch Lancashire who will be accompanied by the CEO of Healthwatch England."

VIC Creative Hub is also stall selling a selection of craft items.

Trinity Remembrance Garden, which VIC wrote a supporting letter for, will be officially opened.

Members of VIC Amanda Walton, Chief Executive, and Phil Speddy will be present at a special VE Day 80 Civic Evensong at Blackburn Cathedral on **Saturday May 11 at 4pm** and at Lancaster Castle for a beacon lighting ceremony.

VIC has held previous team building events at Alternate Forces, Burnley Football in the Community's Whitehough and Outdoor Elements in Simonstone.


## Hearts to hold

## Candle making workshop


A **CANDLE** making workshop will be held at VIC and anyone interested in taking part should contact Arts and Crafts Co-ordinator Darren Horsnell for more information.

**A HUGE** thank you to the Patient Participation Group at Irwell Medical Practice, in Bacup, for donating £250 to VIC.




Bob Elliott said: "We would like to thank the PPG, and Chairman Margaret Talukdar, for this kind donation."
